

Evacuating

- Why/When Evacuate
 - Fire
 - Tsunami threat
 - Structure unsafe
 - Predicted flooding
 - Order issued
- 2 ways out
- Leave early
- ID Meeting Place



- Water & snacks
- 1st aid kit & extra medications

Go-Bags

- Cash
- Flashlight & batteries
- Battery powered or crank radio
- Dust mask (N-95) & g
- Phone chargers & powerbanks
- Toiletries and Sanitation
- Maps & Important documents
- Clothing & shoes

Grab & Go List

- "Need" items should be in Go Bag & kit
- Establish list of "Want" items
- Organize by priority or location
- Practice loading into car
 - Does it all fit?
 - How long did it take?
- Hastens ability to evacuate



Defensible Space

Hardening Your Home

Cut all dry grass (Mowers can start fires wait for cool, moist days) Trees spaced and limbed up 10' to reduce fire spread

> Trim trees at least 10' from chimney and roof

Clean roof and rain gutters regularly

Lower tree limbs removed 10' to reduce "fire ladder"

> Space and maintain fire-resistant plants and shrubs to prevent fire from spreading



- Why Shelter in Place
 - Outside more dangerous than inside
 - Hazardous material spill
 - No/Minimal damage
 - No safe egress
 - Air Quality
 - Widespread Power Outage
 - Pandemic
 - Order issued
- Disaster Kit
- Stay informed






Chipper Program
