TAKE ACTION

AlertMarin sends critical information from local agencies during a disaster if **you need to take action**. Register up to five phones in your household.

Alerts may include:

- Wildfire and evacuation information
- Information *during* an event about evacuation routes, shelters, transportation

BE AWARE

Nixle sends out general public safety information alerts via text based on your zip code about local issues.

You can also sign up for alerts from multiple zip codes such as those of your family members and where you work. Alerts may include:

- Road closures, police activity, missing persons
- Post-disaster information about shelters, transportation, or supplies

BYPASS DO NOT DISTURB ON YOUR PHONE

Don't miss an emergency call from AlertMarin on your mobile phone at night

If you are sent an Alert at night and **DO NOT DISTURB** is activated on your cell phone, you won't hear the call. Follow the instructions below for your mobile phone operating system.

Android

1. Create a **Contact** for **AlertMarin 415 473-6376** and tap the **Star** icon in the top right to make it a favorite.
2. Go to **Settings** and in the Search bar at the top of the screen, enter **Do Not Disturb**.
3. Follow the instructions for the Android system on your phone.

iPhone

1. Create a **Contact** for **Alert Marin 415 473-6376**.
2. Tap the **Edit** button in the upper-right corner, and scroll down and select **Ringtone**.
3. The first item on the screen is **Emergency Bypass**. Toggle it on.
4. Tap **Done** in the top right.

Evacuation Routes for Bayside Acres



If Main Drive is blocked, the alternative way out is the lane adjacent to the Glenwood School that connects Main Drive to Knight Drive in Glenwood. There is a gate at this location.

SRFD emergency vehicles have keys to the locks on the two gates that block access to the alternate route.

If Bayview Drive is blocked, the alternative way out is via the driveway at 225 Bayview, which leads to Tweed Terrace in Loch Lomond. The owners will make every effort to leave the gate open for an easy exit to safety. Contact firewise@baysideacres.org for the gate code to store with your important papers.

Pet Evacuation

*These tips are important not only for your pets' safety, but also for yours.
Children often won't leave without their pets*

- **Pet Carriers:** Have one for each pet. If you receive a “Warning” you can put them in early before they panic.
- **Microchip your pets** in case they get lost.
- **Pet Go Kits:**
 - **Food** for 1 day plus a little extra to mix with new food you will have to buy later
 - 1 **water** for your pet and 2 for you
 - Collapsible **water bowls, leashes, Litter box. Toy.**
 - Pack your dog's **satchel**. Gives them a task.
 - Using a sharpie marker **write your phone # on your pets' bellies**
 - **Documentation:** Hardcopy or electronic of you pets' vaccinations so you can show a kennel, vet, etc.
 - **Put up an Evacuated Sign if you leave your home** so fire fighters don't have to go look for you or your pets.
 - **Know the hotels/motels** outside your area that take pets
 - **Make a connection with a vet outside of your area** in case of evacuation.

- Time How Long it Takes You.

- **Noon:** We will hold a Zoom De-Brief to discuss how we all did and what we learned.
